This annual report informs you about the 2015 activities of the Honoring Eva Foundation. As you know our mission is to support students with scholarships in the 4 Year Training for Core Therapist and in the 2 Year Transformational Program.

Building on this mission we received the tremendous support of \leq 27.834 from sponsors/donators and through all kind of activities. We were so encouraged by all donations that we could offer 7 scholarships (\leq 10.620) and 6 loans (\leq 5.420).

In 2015 we succeeded in:

- making the Foundation more alive and visible in the community
- finding a new balance between helping and enabling students
- finding new creative ways and ideas to generate money

We are very happy with the commitment of the students that organized several activities to raise money.
